Old Testament: Zachariah 12: 8-10; 13:1

⁸ On that day the LORD will put a shield about the inhabitants of Jerusalem so that the feeblest among them on that day shall be like David, and the house of David shall be like God, like the angel of the LORD, at their head. ⁹ And on that day I will seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem. ¹⁰ "And I will pour out on the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem a spirit of compassion and supplication, so that, when they look on him whom they have pierced, they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for an only child, and weep bitterly over him, as one weeps over a first-born.

¹ "On that day there shall be a fountain opened for the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem to cleanse them from sin and uncleanness.



The Epistle: Galations 3: 23-29

²³ Now before faith came, we were confined under the law, kept under restraint until faith should be revealed. ²⁴ So that the law was our custodian until Christ came, that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵ But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a custodian; ²⁶ for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. ²⁷ For as many of you as

were baptized into Christ have put on Christ.
²⁸ There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹ And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise.



The Gospel: Luke 9: 18-24

¹⁸ Now it happened that as he was praying alone the disciples were with him; and he asked them, "Who do the people say that I am?" ¹⁹ And they answered, "John the Baptist; but others say, Eli'jah; and others, that one of the old prophets has risen." ²⁰ And he said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" And Peter answered, "The Christ of God." ²¹ But he charged and commanded them to tell this to no one, ²² saying, "The Son of man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised." ²³ And he said to all, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. ²⁴ For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake, he will save it.

Do You Know?

1. As Anglicans we receive the Bread on our tongue or in our hand. When we receive in the hand it is always the right hand over the left.
2. The Prayer Book provides the introduction for each of the lessons read at Morning and Evening Prayers and The Eucharist. There is no need for the reader to say "Good Morning Church". We must desist from this attitude and allow ourselves to be guided by our Prayer Book.
3. Out of all of the Christian symbols, the Cross is the most universally accepted. More than four thousand various shapes of the cross are in existence.



The Tau Cross

This is a cross shaped like the Greek letter T. It is called the Tau Cross, Old Testament, Advent, or St. Anthony's Cross, came to be used by early Christians instead of more obvious forms of the cross because they feared non Christians who might not be sympathetic to participants in what was then an illegal movement. According to traditions, the blood on the Israelites' door posts to save the first born formed this type of Cross. It is also said to be the type of Cross on which Moses lifted up the brazen serpent, and is sometimes called the ANTICIPATORY CROSS (Numbers 21: 8-9, John 3:14)
